Overview & Current Events

Comcast is a media, entertainment and communications company that offers video, internet and phone services. Its business units include Cable Communications (video, Internet, voice; Xfinity brand), Cable Networks (cable networks, regional sports, news, etc.), Broadcast Television (NBC, Telemundo), Filmed Entertainment and Theme Parks. Comcast was founded in 1963, is headquartered in Philadelphia, PA, and is currently valued at \$194 billion.

Comcast reported its first quarter earnings results on April 25. The company reported revenues of \$26.9 billion for the first quarter, which represents an increase of 18% year-over-year. This tremendous top line growth rate was possible due to the closing of the acquisition of Sky during late 2018, which impacted Comcast's results positively. Underlying organic revenue performance has been robust, as cable communications revenues rose 4.2% year over year, to \$14.3 billion. NBCUniversal also generated a solid revenue growth rate when adjusted for one-time impacts from the Olympics and the Super Bowl during the previous year's quarter. Filmed Entertainment revenues rose by an attractive pace of 7.4% year over year; only Theme Park revenues were down marginally year over year.

Comcast was able to translate the compelling revenue growth rate into a strong earnings-per-share performance, as Q1's earnings-per-share of \$0.76 were up 17% compared to the first quarter of fiscal 2018. Comcast's EBITDA (adjusted) rose by a highly attractive pace of 18% year over year. Comcast continued to generate strong cash flows; free cash generation totaled \$4.6 billion during the first quarter alone. Comcast uses the majority of that to deleverage.

Comcast has a very compelling earnings growth history. From 2009 to 2018, its earnings-per-share grew every year. Annual growth averaged 17% over those nine years. Over the last five years its growth has slowed down a bit, averaging 14.8% annually since 2013, which has still been a very compelling - and consistent - rate of earnings growth.

There are several drivers for Comcast's earnings growth. The first one is ongoing revenue growth, driven primarily by Cable revenues. Cable revenues grew by four percent during Q1, primarily due to a higher customer count. Cable revenues have grown by mid-single digits for the last ten quarters, and it seems reasonable to assume that growth will continue going forward. The Video segment is battling against the impact of cord-cutting, but so far higher revenues in the high-speed internet business could offset this headwind. NBCUniversal saw its revenues rise as well during 2018, with a positive contribution from all its segments. The Filmed Television segment can be a bit cyclical, though.

Apart from revenue growth, Comcast's earnings were driven by margin increases in the past, but more recently Comcast was not able to materially increase its margins. During the first quarter of fiscal 2019, Comcast's EBITDA grew at a similar rate to its revenues, and earnings-per-share growth was comparable as well. Comcast benefited from tax law changes. The company's share count will likely continue to decline, which is a positive for Comcast's earnings-per-share, although Comcast plans to focus on deleveraging for a while following the takeover of Sky.

Comcast's shares are currently valued at roughly fifteen and a half times 2019's earnings, which is almost perfectly in line with our fair value estimate. Shares traded at a high-teens earnings multiple several years in a row, but the median earnings multiple over the last decade is lower than that, at roughly the current level.

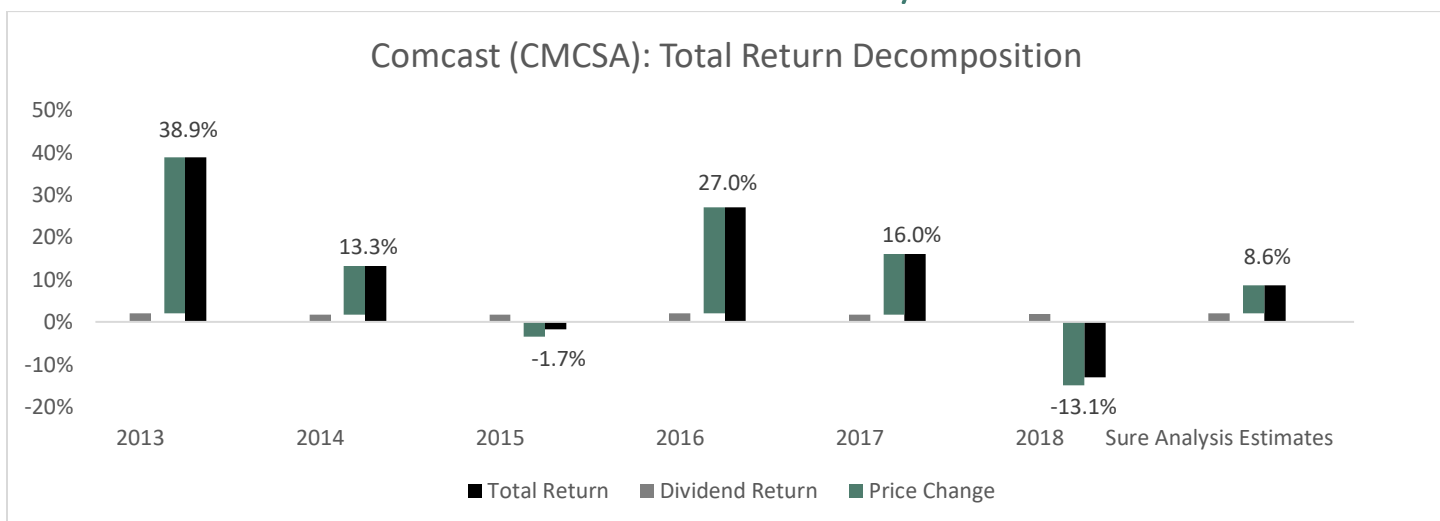
Comcast has raised its dividend for 10 years in a row, and its dividend growth rate was compelling throughout that decade. The fast dividend growth was possible through a combination of a solid earnings growth rate and an increase in Comcast's dividend payout ratio. The dividend payout ratio is still quite low, and we believe that the dividend looks very safe for the foreseeable future, as it is well-covered by both earnings and cash flows.

Comcast is one of the largest players in the entertainment industry. New market entrants would have to spend many billions of dollars to establish themselves as a cable player or major entertainment network. As a result, competitive pressures are not very high. The whole cable industry is impacted by the nationwide cord-cutting trend, though, as some customers are ditching traditional pay-TV entirely. Comcast has so far been able to withstand this trend through growth from its other businesses. During the last financial crisis Comcast grew its earnings-per-share, largely because demand for its services is not really cyclical.

Final Thoughts & Recommendation

Comcast has been a high-quality growth company over the last decade, having produced a highly compelling earnings growth rate and raising its dividend at a fast pace on top of that. Going forward, earnings-per-share growth will slow down, but the company should be able to weather the cord-cutting trend. Shares don't look undervalued any longer, which is why we rate them a hold for now.
