Overview & Current Events

Verizon Communications was created by a merger between Bell Atlantic Corp and GTE Corp in June 2000. Verizon is one of the largest wireless carriers in the country. Wireless contributes three-quarters of all revenues, and broadband and cable services account for about a quarter of sales. The company's network covers ~298 million people and 98% of the U.S. Verizon has a market capitalization of nearly \$228 billion, with annual sales of \$131 billion.

Verizon has now launched 5G Ultra-Wideband in nine cities as it continues its rollout of 5G service. At the end of July, customers in parts of Atlanta, Detroit, Indianapolis and Washington, D.C. were now able to access the company's 5G network. Verizon is the first of the major carriers to turn on 5G service.

Verizon reported financial results for the first quarter on 8/1/2019. The company earned \$1.23 per share, beating estimates by \$0.03 and growing 2.5% from the previous year. Revenue declined 0.4% to \$32.1 billion, which was \$349 million lower than expected.

Wireless revenues grew 1% to \$22.7 billion. Service revenues increased 3.1%. Retail postpaid net additions totaled 451K, which was a 29% improvement from the previous year. Included in this figure was 420K postpaid smartphone net adds. Retail postpaid phone churn was an industry best 0.76%. Verizon continues to see customer migration to higher-priced plans. Fios revenue improved 1.9% aided by 34K net additions. Fios video lost a net 52K subscribers, though this was below consensus estimates of nearly 55K net losses.

Verizon maintains its expectations for earnings-per-share for the year to increase at a low-single-digit rate from 2018 versus previous guidance of no growth. Revenues for the year are still expected to grow at a low single-digit rate.

Verizon has seen its earnings-per-share grow at a rate of almost 5% per year for the past 10 years. We have lowered our forward growth rate to 4% from 5% due to the company's guidance of low single digit earnings growth. While a lower growth rate is not an ideal situation, Verizon is a clear beneficiary of a lower tax rate. The company added \$10 billion to its free cash flow in 2018. The company's effective tax rate should be ~25% in 2019. Applying our expected earnings growth rate to the company's guidance for 2019 means that shares of Verizon could earn \$5.84 per share by 2024.

Verizon gave shareholders a 2.1% dividend increase for payment made this past November. The company has now increased its dividend for the past 14 years, and has compounded it dividend by a rate of 2.4% over the last decade.

Shares of Verizon have decreased \$2, or 3.5%, since our 4/23/2019 update. Based off the current share price and expectations for 2019 earnings-per-share, Verizon has a forward P/E of 11.5. This is below the average P/E of 14 for the past decade. If shares were to return to this ratio by 2024, the valuation would be a 4.0% tailwind to total annual returns over this time. With a dividend yield above 4%, Verizon's stock offers investors a yield that is more than double that of both the S&P 500 and 10-year Treasury Bond.

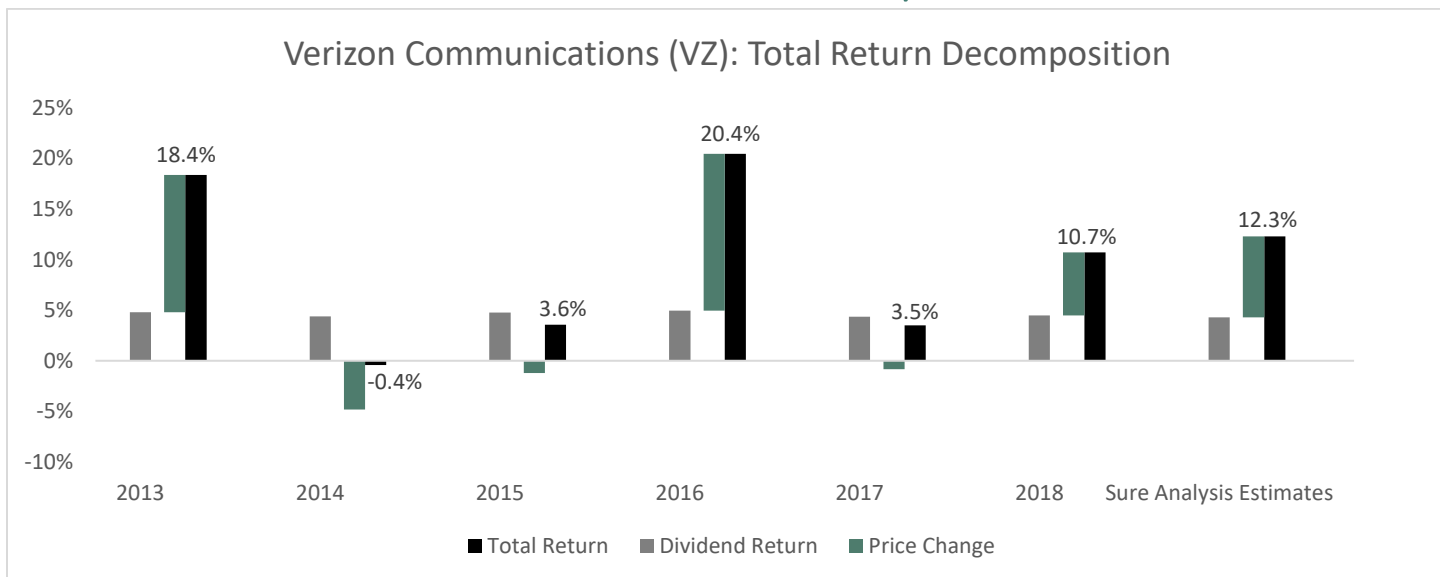
While investors aren't likely to see a sizeable pickup in earnings growth, Verizon offers a very high and stable dividend yield. The company has seen its cash flow increase dramatically thanks to a lower tax rate. While the current net debt level is still high, it has been reduced recently.

One of Verizon's key competitive advantages is that it is often considered the best wireless carrier in the U.S. This is evident by the company's wireless net additions and very low churn rate. This reliable service allows Verizon to maintain its customer base as well as give the company an opportunity to move customers to higher-priced plans. Verizon is also in the early stages of rolling out 5G service, which will give it an advantage over other carriers. Another advantage for Verizon is the stock's ability to withstand a downturn in the market. For example, the stock weathered the selloff in late 2018 very well, gaining almost 7% for the year while the S&P 500 dropped 6%.

Final Thoughts & Recommendation

We expect that Verizon Communication will offer a total annual return of 12.3% through 2024, up from our previous estimate of 11.4%. The company had a solid second quarter, with strong growth in net retail postpaid adds. Phone churn was the best in the industry and although Fios video subscribers did decline, it was not as bad as expected. We continue to believe that shares of Verizon offer a solid combination of earnings growth, dividend yield and multiple expansion. The stock also seems to hold up during market selloffs. While we find that AT&T (T) offers a slightly better total return at the moment, Verizon receives a buy recommendation from Sure Dividend due to double-digit growth potential over the next five years. We reiterate our 2024 price target of \$82 for the stock.
