Overview & Current Events

SAP SE develops, sells, and maintains a variety of enterprise software products that are used by corporations, governments, and educational agencies. The company employs more than 103,000 people and has more than 400,000 customers in 180 countries. SAP is headquartered in Germany and reports financial results in Euros. American investors can initiate an ownership stake in SAP through American Depositary Receipts that trade on the New York Stock Exchange under the ticker SAP.

SAP reported its first quarter earnings results on April 22. The company recorded revenues of €7.1 billion during the quarter, which is equal to around \$8 billion. SAP's revenues during the quarter were up 12% year over year, accelerating from the previous quarter's growth rate. SAP's cloud revenue growth totaled 31% during the quarter, which was well above the growth rate seen in previous quarters. SAP's strong cloud revenue growth also was a key driving factor for the company's overall strong revenue performance during the period.

SAP's earnings-per-share totaled €1.00, or \$1.06 on an adjusted basis during the first quarter. This represents a 28% decline year-over-year on an adjusted basis. Profits were significantly lower than what analysts had forecasted. During all of 2021, SAP generated earnings-per-share growth of 22% relative to 2021, but profits are expected to decline this year. The company guides for revenue growth of 23% to 26% in the cloud segment, while cloud and software revenue, overall, is forecasted to grow around 5% this year. The company raised its dividend to €2.45, or \$2.60 for 2022.

SAP has managed to generate impressive business growth over the last ten years. During the last decade the enterprise software giant compounded its adjusted earnings-per-share at 13% per year. The data in the above table is impacted by currency rate changes, since SAP reports its results in €, and generates a substantial amount of its revenues in € and other currencies. For US-based investors, results can thus vary widely on a year-to-year basis, depending on the currency rate changes between the € and the US\$. This holds true for the dividends as well, which are also declared in €.

SAP's management recently announced updated medium-term goals for the next couple of years, primarily centered around growth in its cloud business. SAP plans to grow its cloud computing revenues to €22 billion by 2025, which equates to roughly \$25 billion at current exchange rates. This is still several years ahead, but this would equate to an attractive longer-term cloud computing growth rate, compared to the forecasted cloud revenues of €11.5 billion in 2022. SAP has grown its revenue consistently in the past. We believe that the strong position in the enterprise software industry will allow SAP to grow its profits meaningfully as well, despite some margin headwinds in the near term.

SAP has been valued at a relatively high valuation throughout most of the last decade, trading for more than 20 times net profits during the majority of those years. Due to the company's above-average historic growth rate and strong position in the markets it addresses, it seems justified that SAP trades at somewhat of a premium valuation. Shares have declined since our last update and are trading below our fair value estimate right now. We thus see some upside potential for SAP's shares from a valuation perspective over the coming years.

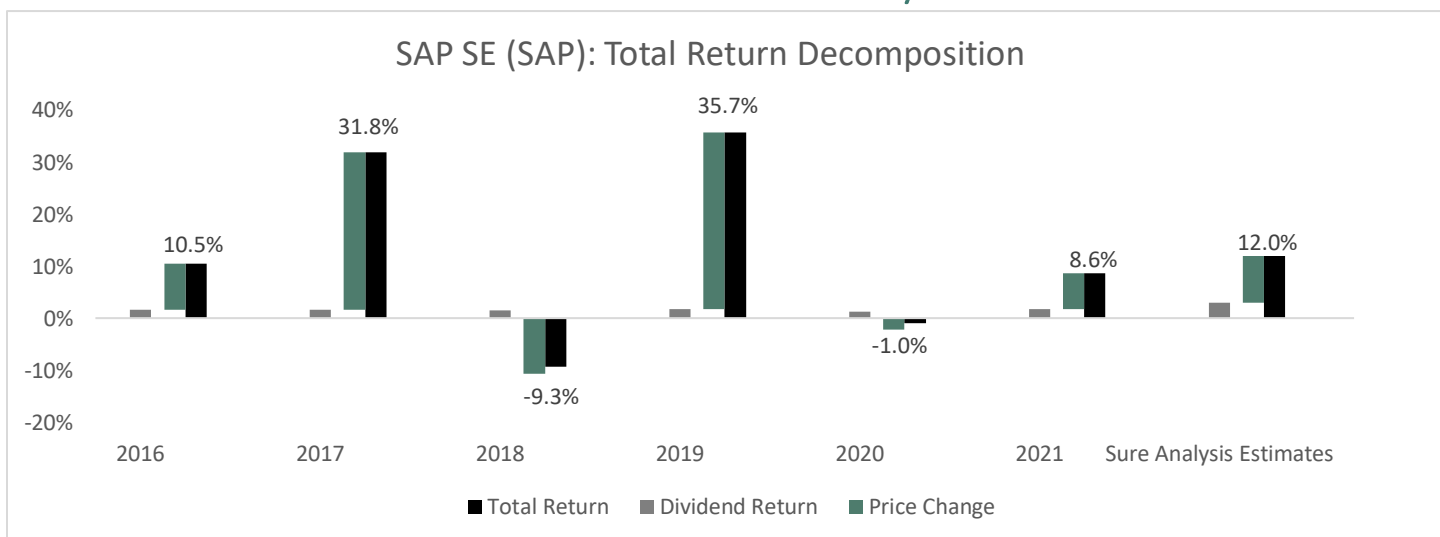
SAP's dividend payout ratio never reached above 50%, even during the last financial crisis. Today, SAP pays out around one-third of its net profits in the form of dividends, which makes the dividend look quite safe. Due to currency rates fluctuating, the payout for US-based investors can vary from year to year, though, and declines are possible.

SAP's strongest competitive advantage is its recurring revenue business model. During fiscal 2020, more than two-thirds of the company's revenue was recurring in nature, or what management calls predictable revenue. This ratio of predictable revenue has risen consistently in the last couple of years. Recurring revenue allows the company to optimize customer retention rates and to use the resulting cash flows to aggressively invest in growth opportunities, such as its cloud business. Due to SAP's global scale and renowned brand, competition is not a major problem.

Final Thoughts & Recommendation

As a leading enterprise software company, SAP has established a strong global presence and benefits from scale advantages versus its peers. The company has delivered solid results in the past, including during the pandemic years 2020 and 2021. SAP is not vulnerable to recessions and has strong fundamentals. Profits will likely decline this year, but SAP trades below our fair value estimate and promises compelling longer-term returns, which is why we rate it a buy.
