Overview & Current Events

Badger Meter was founded in 1905 in Milwaukee, WI. The company's first product was a "frost proof" water meter. Today, Badger Meter manufactures and markets meters and valves that are used to measure and control the flow of liquids, such as water, oil and various chemicals. The company's products are also used to control the flow of air and other gases. Badger Meter generates ~\$600 million in annual revenues. The company is also a founding member of the American Water Works Association, a trade group that sets water measurement standards in the U.S.

On January 27th, 2023, Badger Meter announced fourth quarter and full year earnings results for the period ending December 31st, 2022. For the quarter, revenue grew 8.5% to \$147.3 million, which was \$4.42 million higher than expected. Earnings-per-share of \$0.60 compared favorably to earnings-per-share of \$0.59 in the prior year and was \$0.01 above estimates. For the year, revenue grew 11.9% to a record \$565.6 million while earnings-per-share of \$2.26 was up from \$2.08 in 2021.

The utility water business grew 9%, led again by high demand for E-Series Ultrasonic meters and ORION Cellular endpoints. Revenue for flow instrumentation products was up 8% due to demand in all water-focused end market applications while supply chain constraints eased during the quarter. Gross margins contracted 170 basis points to 38.7% while the operating margin was lower by 150 basis points to 15.3%.

We forecast that Badger Meter will earn \$2.58 per share in 2023, which would be a 14.2% increase from the prior year.

Badger Meter has increased earnings per share by 11.5% per year over the past decade and 10.9% over the last five years. The company's business was resilient in the face of the pandemic in 2020, showing Badger Meter's underlying strength. We have increased our projected earnings growth to 8% from 7% to reflect the quality of results over the medium- and long-term. Badger Meter's ability to control costs, and thereby boost margins, should help offset any weakness in revenue that may occur due to supply chain issues.

Badger Meter raised its dividend 12.5% for the September 9th, 2022 payment, extending the company's dividend growth streak to 30 years.

Shares of Badger Meter have gained \$24, or 24.7%, since our October 19th, 2022 update. We reaffirm our target P/E ratio of 26 to bring it more in-line with the stock's long-term average valuation. The stock has a current P/E ratio of 46.9, meaning that shareholders are very likely to see significant headwinds from valuation reversion in the coming years. Reverting to our target valuation by 2028 would reduce annual returns by 11.1% over this period of time. We see a declining valuation as the catalyst for the yield to rise to 1.4% from the current yield.

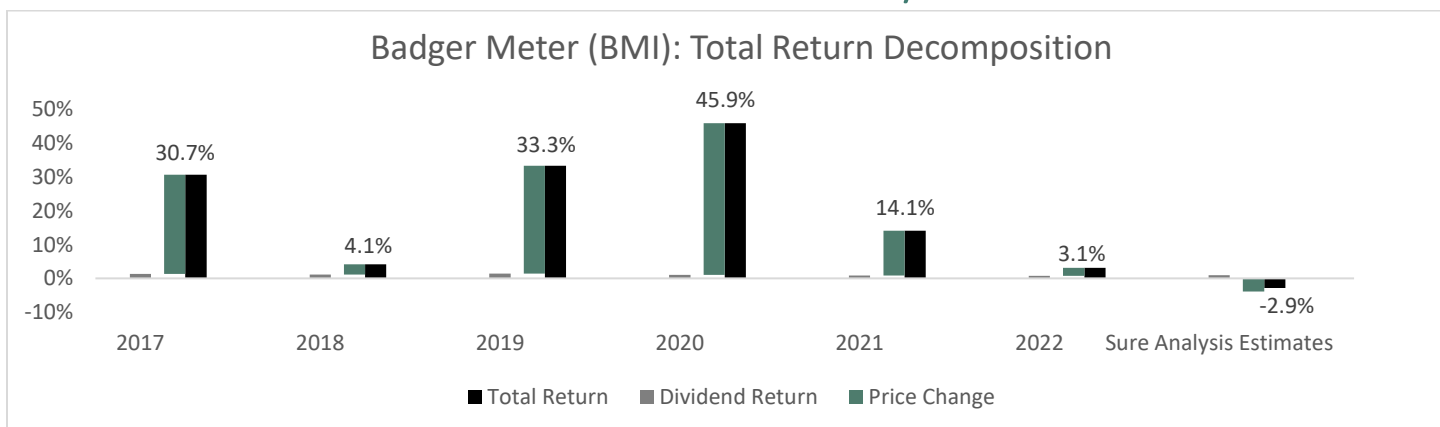
Given Badger Meter's 30-year dividend increase streak and reasonable payout ratio, the dividend is very safe today. We also see plenty of room for growth in the payout, so Badger Meter is certainly attractive from a dividend growth perspective.

Unlike many companies at the height of the last recession, earnings-per-share for Badger Meter actually improved. The vast majority of the company's sales are made to municipal water utilities. A key competitive advantage that Badger Meter possess is that consumers require access to water, regardless of economic conditions. In addition, it is estimated that there are more than 30 million water meters in the U.S. that are not monitored with the advanced equipment that Badger Meter offers. And with some states, like California, looking to improve its water monitoring systems for use in times of droughts, the company is in a prime position to benefit from upgrades and improvements.

Final Thoughts & Recommendation

After fourth quarter earnings results, Badger Meter is projected to lose 2.9% annually through 2028, compared to our prior estimate of a loss of 1.9% per year. This projected loss stems from an 8% earnings growth rate and starting yield of 0.7% that are more than offset by multiple compression. Badger Meter continues to see strong results from both its water utility business and flow instrumentation businesses. We have increased our five-year price target \$17 to \$99 due to earnings estimates for the year and a higher projected growth rate moving forward. However, Badger Meter continues to earn a sell rating due to projected returns.
