Overview & Current Events

Oracle is an information technology company that provides software, hardware, and services. Its offerings include applications, platforms, and infrastructure technologies (cloud software), hardware products such as servers, hardware-related software products (e.g., operating systems) and services such as consultation & education. Oracle was founded in 1977, and is headquartered in Redwood City, CA.

Oracle reported its most recent quarterly results, for its fiscal third quarter, on March 10th. The company generated revenues of \$17.2 billion during the quarter, which represents an increase of 22% year-over-year. This was more than what was expected by the analyst community, with the consensus estimate being beaten by \$280 million.

Oracle generated earnings-per-share of \$1.79 during the third quarter, which was up 21% versus the prior year's quarter, and which beat the consensus estimate easily. Oracle sees compelling growth tailwinds from the ongoing Artificial Intelligence revolution, with its cloud infrastructure revenues rising by a strong 84% during the quarter, and with its backlog and remaining performance obligations growing at a very strong pace: Remaining performance obligations were up by more than 300%, increasing to more than \$550 billion. For the current fiscal year, Oracle is forecasted to earn significantly more compared to the previous fiscal year, at around \$7.45 per share, which would be up by double-digits compared to the previous year. Thanks to Oracle's huge bookings growth, earnings growth will likely be appealing in the coming years, too.

Oracle recorded compelling growth rates in the 2015-2025 time frame, with earnings-per-share growth averaging around 8% over that time frame. There were some ups and downs in Oracle's earnings, however, and growth was not very evenly distributed. Investments in its business to move it towards the software-as-a-service model were necessary, which led to somewhat uneven margins. The company fared well during the pandemic and during the Great Recession before that, indicating that Oracle's business isn't very cyclical.

Oracle is not operating a cloud business as large as its peers Amazon or Microsoft, but it still is generating attractive growth in the markets it addresses. Infrastructure-as-a-Service, as well as Platform-as-a-Service, are markets that are growing at a fast pace, and should allow Oracle to maintain an attractive cloud computing growth rate going forward. Oracle Fusion ERP and Oracle's Autonomous Database are touted by management as current and future growth drivers due to compelling pricing and top-tier technology. Cost reduction programs have also had a positive margin effect at times in the past, and the company could be able to improve its cost basis further in the future. Despite a high number of new shares being issued to employees and management, Oracle's share count has declined over the last decade. Thanks to cloud and AI tailwinds, we believe earnings growth will be compelling in the foreseeable future.

Oracle's share price has declined since our last update, as enthusiasm waned versus the peak levels seen over the last year. This has made shares cheaper, and they are now no longer trading above fair value, but very close to our fair value estimate. We believe total returns will not be meaningfully impacted by valuation changes in the coming years.

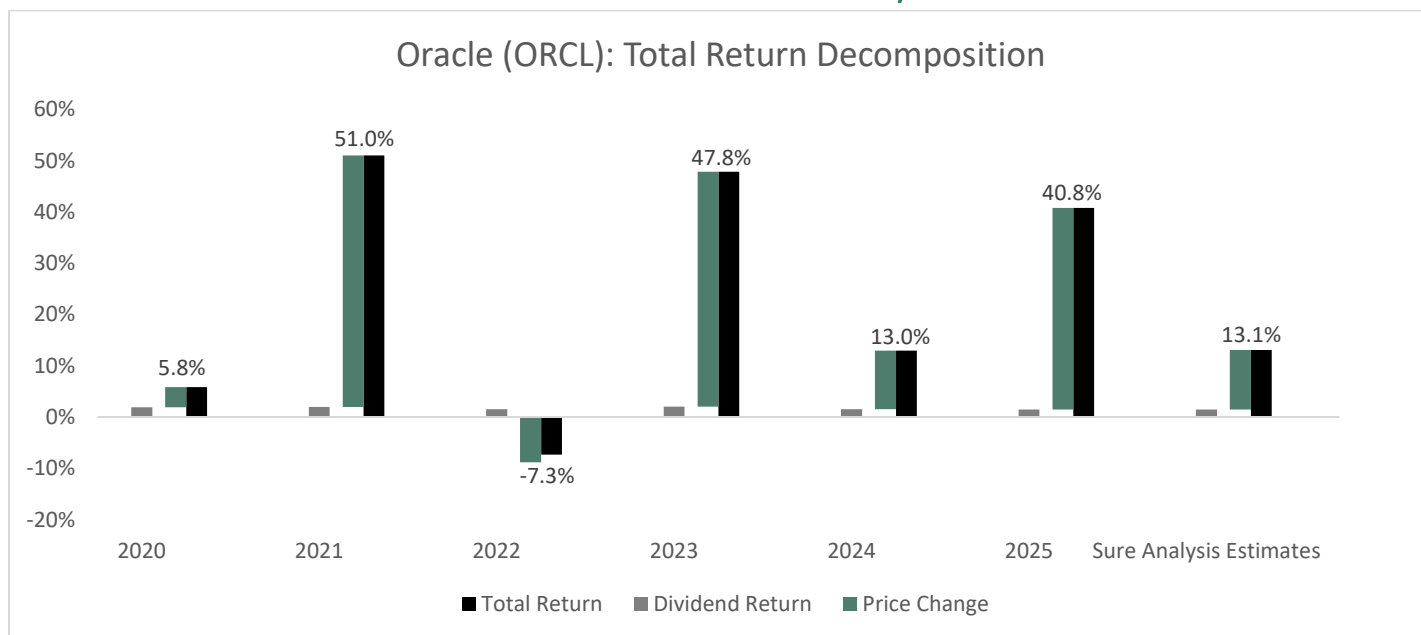
Oracle's dividend payout ratio was very low a decade ago, but since then the payout ratio has risen to some degree. At a payout ratio of less than 30%, the dividend is still very well-covered, and there is still a lot of room for further dividend increases. Due to the low payout ratio and the fact that the company was not impacted to a large degree during past crises, Oracle's dividend is rated safe.

Oracle was not hurt during the Great Recession, and the coronavirus pandemic did not have a large impact on Oracle's business, either. Oracle has some size and scale advantages over smaller peers, although it is itself a smaller player versus peers such as Microsoft in the cloud computing industry. Thanks to strong market-wide growth rates, all companies in this field can grow at the same time, which eases competitive pressures.

Final Thoughts & Recommendation

Oracle's shift towards cloud computing continues. Between revenue growth, strong cost controls, and buybacks, Oracle's earnings-per-share grew at a nice pace over the last decade, and thanks to AI tailwinds, growth could accelerate going forward. Oracle hit a new record profit in fiscal 2025, and fiscal 2026 will most likely be better as Oracle is forecasted to see its earnings-per-share improve meaningfully this year. With shares trading at fair value and promising appealing returns, we rate Oracle a buy right now.
