Overview & Current Events

Landmark Bancorp, Inc. (LARK) is a financial holding company. The company's business consists of the ownership of Landmark National Bank and Landmark Risk Management, Inc. The bank is predominantly engaged in the business of attracting deposits from the community and using such deposits, together with borrowings and other funds, to originate one-to-four family residential real estate, construction and land, commercial real estate, commercial, agriculture, municipal, and consumer loans. In addition, the company invests in certain investment and mortgage-related securities. As of the first quarter of 2026, the company's total assets were \$1.61 billion, total gross loans were \$1.10 billion, and total deposits were \$1.32 billion. Landmark Bancorp has 29 branch offices in 23 communities across the state of Kansas. The company was founded in 1885 and has 275 employees.

On April 29th, 2026, Landmark Bancorp announced its financial results for the first quarter for the period ending March 31st, 2026. For the quarter, the company reported net earnings of \$5.1 million, an increase from \$4.7 million in the fourth quarter of 2025, and up from \$4.7 million in the same quarter last year. Reported diluted earnings per share for the quarter was \$0.83, compared to \$0.77 in the fourth quarter of 2025 and \$0.77 in the first quarter of 2025.

The increase in quarterly earnings was primarily due to growth in net interest income and improved margin, partially offset by higher non-interest expenses including fraud-related costs.

Average loan balances declined by \$12.8 million compared to the prior quarter, and end-of-period loans decreased by \$13.5 million. While total deposits declined \$66.2 million, core customer deposits excluding brokered and public funds grew both quarter-over-quarter and year-over-year. To support liquidity, FHLB borrowings increased \$57.3 million, bringing the loan-to-deposit ratio to 82.1% from 79.1% at year-end. Net interest income rose to \$15.0 million, a \$234,000 or 1.6% increase from the prior quarter and a 14.5% increase year-over-year, driven by higher interest income and lower interest expense. Gains on loan sales increased year-over-year due to higher loan sale volumes, supporting non-interest income of \$3.8 million for the quarter. The company's net interest margin improved to 4.24%, up from 4.03% in the prior quarter and 3.76% in year-ago quarter. For the reporting period, the return on average assets was 1.29%, the return on average equity was 12.65%, and the efficiency ratio was 62.7%, compared to 1.17%, 11.88%, and 62.8% in the prior quarter, respectively. Credit quality showed some deterioration: non-performing loans were \$10.4 million, or 0.94% of gross loans, while net loan charge-offs totaled \$349,000, slightly higher than the prior quarter.

The company highlighted a focus on efficiency improvements, balance sheet strength, and continued investment in revenue-generating activities, while maintaining disciplined risk management.

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The company has grown earnings by 8.4% per year in the last decade and 1.9% over the past five years. We expect earnings to increase by 6% per year for the next five years. The company has been able to increase its dividend for an impressive 21 consecutive years. Over the last five years, the average annual dividend growth rate is 5.6%. In February 2024, the company increased its quarterly dividend by 5.0% from \$0.20 to \$0.21 per share. The company also declared a 5% stock dividend that was payable in December 2025. This is the 25th consecutive year that the company has declared a 5% stock dividend.

During the past decade shares of Landmark Bancorp have traded with an average price-to-earnings ratio of about 11.6 and today, it stands at 8.2. We are using 10 times earnings as a fair value baseline, implying the potential for a valuation tailwind. The stock’s dividend yield is currently 3.2% which is in line with the average yield of 3.2% for the past decade.

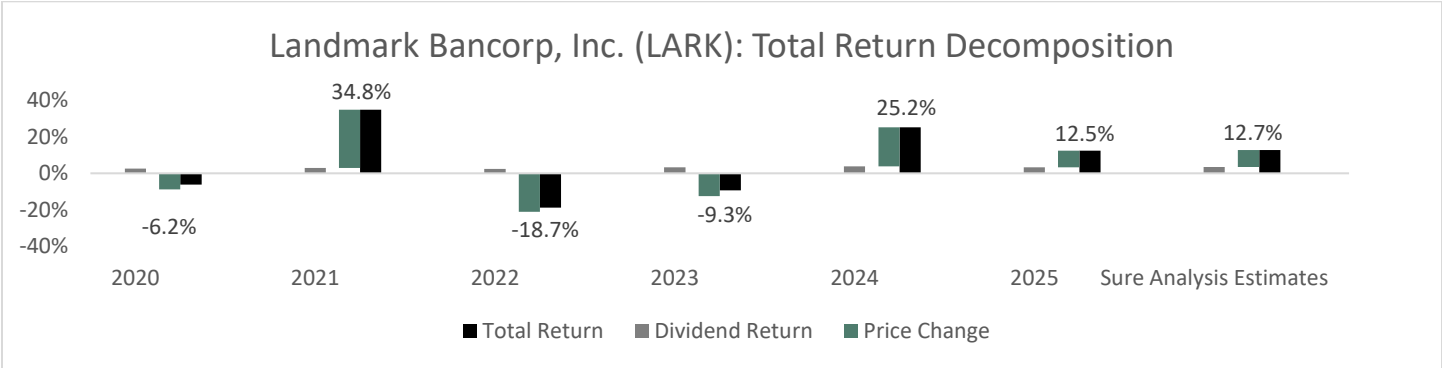
During the past five years, the company’s dividend payout ratio has averaged around 32%. Landmark Bancorp’s dividend is at the moment comfortably covered by earnings. Given the expected earnings growth, there is room for the dividend to continue to grow at least at the same pace and keep the payout ratio around the same levels which is safe.

Landmark Bancorp has demonstrated a solid financial performance combined with a sound asset quality track record and has a business model focused on community banking. As a result, the company has an impressive track record of 21 consecutive years of dividend increases. Landmark Bancorp has increased its dividends by ≥5% each year since 2001. Landmark Bancorp’s business model is primarily built upon lending money to local businesses and residents within the local communities the bank serves. The funding of those loans is done by gathering local deposits through their 29 branch offices. The bank has a diversified loan portfolio and a low-cost core deposit base. The non-interest income is also stable and diversified based on fees and services charges, gains on sales of loans and bank owned life insurance. The company has shown a decent track record of organic and acquisitive growth since 2000 including the recent acquisition of Freedom Bancshares, Inc.

Final Thoughts & Recommendation

Landmark Bancorp is an old and well-established regional bank active in 23 communities across the state of Kansas. The company has a solid dividend track record and offers an above average yield. We estimate total return potential of 12.7% per year for the next five years based on a 6% earnings-per-share growth, the dividend, and a valuation tailwind. Shares earn a buy rating.
